1. Introduction

- 1.1. Nottinghamshire County Council and Nottingham City Council is undertaking a Habitats Regulations Assessment (HRA) of the proposed Main Modifications to its Joint Waste Local Plan (hereafter referred to as the 'Plan') as part of the examination the Plan.
- 1.2. The Councils prepared an <u>HRA Screening Report of the Waste Local Plan</u> in June 2023 prior to publishing the Plan and submitting it for examination to determine if further HRA work was needed. The report concluded that it was not, since no part of the Plan was considered to have a material impact alone or in combination on protected habitats of European significance. The HRA was submitted to the examination as document <u>CD3</u> and can be found on the <u>examination webpage</u>. It includes background information on the purpose and content of the Plan and on the purpose of a Habitats Regulations Assessment screening report.
- 1.3. The Councils submitted the HRA Screening Report to Natural England on 6 June 2023. The Senior Planning Advisor for Natural England in the East Midlands responded on 12 June 2023 stating: "Thank you for consulting Natural England on the draft Habitats Regulations Assessment Screening Report for the Nottinghamshire & Nottingham Waste Local Plan by your email of 6 June 2023. We have reviewed the report and consider that a correct methodology has been used and that relevant legislation has been referenced. We concur with the scope of the assessment and the identification of relevant designated sites. We acknowledge that the Waste Local Plan does not include any site-specific allocations for waste development but sets out policies which have been screened to determine if there is potential for likely significant effects on European sites from the Waste Plan itself or in combination with impacts from other plans. Natural England therefore agrees with the screening report's conclusion that the Plan is unlikely to generate potential likely significant effects on European sites and that no further work on the HRA would be required".
- 1.4. The Councils sought the advice of Natural England in carrying out a HRA screening report of the proposed Main Modifications. The Main Modifications as proposed do not include any site-specific proposals or policies which would appear to vary the Plan in terms of having likely significant effects on European sites and thus do not appear to impact on the conclusions of the HRA screening report previously undertaken.
- 1.5. To comply with the HRA requirements the Councils proposed to Natural England that a short supplementary statement related to HRA screening of the Main Modifications would be prepared with the intention that Natural England would be consulted on the statement once prepared.
- 1.6. Natural England responded confirming that they were satisfied with this approach and would respond to short supplementary statement related to HRA screening of

the Main Modifications. They agreed with the Councils view that, based on the nature of the Main Modifications outlined in the <u>Post Hearing Action List</u> (EXAM12) these do not appear to impact on the conclusions of the original HRA screening report.

2. Assessment of Main Modifications

- 2.1. The proposed Main Modifications are summarised below and do not include any site-specific allocations which can be screened to determine if there is potential for likely significant effects.
- 2.2. The Main Modifications includes the following matters, which have been screened to determine if there is potential for likely significant effects on European sites. The table below uses a colour coding scheme to illustrate the results of the screening, with "green" cell colour to signify that there are unlikely to be any potential likely significant effects on habitats of European significance.

In combination effects

2.3. The Local Plans for the following districts overlap with the Sherwood ppSPA or associated plantations and areas of acid grassland: Mansfield, Newark & Sherwood, Ashfield, and Bassetlaw. They propose the delivery of housing and employment land over a period leading up to approximately 2038. Delivery of housing could lead to increased recreational pressure on the accessible parts of the Sherwood ppSPA. However, all submitted and adopted local plans in Mansfield, Newark and Bassetlaw have undertaken HRAs which consider impacts on the ppSPA from recreational pressure, and all conclude no adverse effect on integrity due to a combination of measures that all the authorities are introducing.

- Ashfield have prepared a Draft Plan but are proposing to re-issue the Plan with reduced levels of housing and will complete a HRA in due course.
- 2.4. The majority of these Plans relate to local authority areas that are sufficiently distant to the European sites and possible European sites that there is no scope for in combination effects due to disturbance. The Doncaster Local Plan (adopted 2021) covers the area encompassing Hatfield Moor SAC and the Hatfield Moor unit of Thorne and Hatfield Moors SPA. Considering the distance from the Plan area and that there are no site allocations, there is no scope for in combination effects.
- 2.5. In combination effects due to disturbance are not therefore anticipated. Similarly, none of these plans propose development sufficiently close to any European sites or possible European sites of relevance to the Plan that in combination air quality impacts due to dust are a concern.

3. Conclusions

- 3.1. This screening report has been undertaken to assess the Nottinghamshire and Nottingham Waste Local Plan Main Modifications in accordance with the Habitats Regulations to determine the need for appropriate assessment of its likely effect on habitats of European significance in and around Nottingham and Nottinghamshire.
- 3.2. The Waste Local Plan Main Modifications are not proposing site specific allocations of land for waste related development. The Main Modifications do not significantly alter the broad thrust of submitted Local Plan policies against which future applications will be judged. These include policies to safeguard the impact of development on sites of biodiversity, and control the impacts on noise, dust and air quality.
- 3.3. The screening assessment has concluded that there is unlikely to be any significant effects on European sites arising from the proposed Main Modifications of the Joint Waste Local Plan. Therefore, the process does not need to be followed to the next stage and ends here.
